## Safety Around GMS

Our school enrolls over 375 students and we have almost 40 staff members. We are encouraging alternative forms of transportation to and from school, hoping to avoid

There is to be absolutely no parking, please, in the Glanford drop-off area. Thank you for your ongoing care and attention to safety around GMS. Parents are asked to respect the neighboring homes, particularly on Polyanthus Crescent; parents should avoid using Polyanthus as a turn around opportunity.

#### Current Athletic Offerings at GMS

Effective this September 1<sup>st</sup>, there will be some changes to our Kids  $Plus^{TM}$  Accident Insurance policy that will impact our Active Plan holders. Permanent Total Disability coverage will be reduced from \$360,000 to \$100,000 and Dismemberment or Total & Permanent Loss of Use from \$200,000 to \$100,000.
